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Thanks to one organization a Palm Springs teen with cancer will get to go to her prom.

17-year-old Ilse Murillo was diagnosed with bone cancer in August.

"It's really bad, you get sick, you throw up, you don't feel good, you feel weak, and of course your hair loss," said Murillo.

Before her diagnosis, Murillo was a normal care free teenager, excited about entering her senior year at Palm Springs High School.

Because of her illness she can't attend classes and instead has to complete her studies at home.

"It was hard especially because I liked going to school and then I got mad because I couldn't go to school," added Murillo.

She says one of the hardest things is not being able to spend as much time with friends as she wants to.

"My mom just because she doesn't want nothing to happen to me, but she will always be like you have to ask your doctor."

Thanks to Childhood Cancer Foundation of Southern California Murillo can go to prom Saturday night with all of her classmates at the Riviera hotel.
